
### LIFTING THEIR VOICES AND PRAISING GOD

### PREPARING FOR MINISTRY WORK



One of the key elements in helping our students live out our motto of "Transformed Lives...Transforming the World" is recognizing potential giftings and talents, and then providing an appropriate platform that will allow those gifts to grow.

In his freshmen year, Justin Stout expressed a growing interest in the ministry. Therefore, Nate Jackson (Director of Biblical Studies & Discipleship) presented the idea to Justin of practicing teaching the Bible publicly by asking him to speak to the elementary students in their weekly chapel service. "I remember

when my mentor in Miami, Florida gave me the opportunity and responsibility of teaching the High School Youth Group of Florida Bible Church on Sunday mornings when I was 18," Jackson said. "It's hard to listen back to those tapes, as my speaking and preaching was definitely not very polished. However, I thank the Lord that I was at least given the responsibility and opportunity at a young age which allowed me to get practice and experience in becoming an effective speaker. I recognized Justin's winsome personality, sensitivity to the things of the Lord, and desire for future ministry that I wanted to provide for him the same opportunity I was given."

Nervously, Justin planned and prepared for his first message by seeking counsel from his parents and practicing his message on his siblings. By the time Justin finally went up to speak in the Elementary chapel service, he did such a fantastic job that many of the teachers and students begged to have Justin speak again. Throughout the following years of Justin's high school career, Mr. Jackson has used Justin as a regularly scheduled speaker. Each time Justin has improved, causing the elementary students to roar with excitement when they see Justin take the stage.




In seeing Justin's growth and effectiveness, Mr. Jackson has gone on to schedule Justin as a speaker to the Jr. High and High School students as well. This has been a factor in propelling Justin to take on and establish the role of MCS High School Chaplain. #### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD IS UNDERWAY**

O.C.C. is a school-wide project designed to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to children around the world who are suffering from war, poverty, disease, and natural disaster. Every MCS student will have the opportunity to pack shoeboxes filled with collected grade specific items, handmade toys, written letters during our annual school-wide packing party in the MCS courtyard on Friday, November 9. In addition to these items, The Greatest Journey gospel literature is presented to each child at the time they receive their shoebox.

This effort to pack shoeboxes is a powerful way for our students to learn to serve others as our Lord Jesus Christ has served us (Philippians 2:3-4). Last year our goal was 700 boxes and our school packed over 800 boxes. This year our goal is to pack and send 888 boxes!

Here's how you can play a part! From October 3 through November 5, each class will collect the following specific items (bins will be located inside each classroom):

**TK** – Bunches of girls hair ties/scrunchies, hairbrushes & combs, small stuffed animals, pack of small balls (to fit inside a shoe box), Kids flip-flops, Crayons, socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), \$9/box

**Kindergarten** – Bunches of girls hair ties/scrunchies, hairbrushes & combs, small stuffed animals, pack of small balls (to fit inside a shoe box), Kids flip-flops, Crayons, socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), \$9/box

**First Grade** – Bunches of girls hair ties/scrunchies, hairbrushes & combs, small stuffed animals, pack of small balls (to fit inside a shoe box), Kids flip-flops, Crayons, socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), \$9/box

**Second Grade** – Bunches of girls hair ties/scrunchies, small stuffed animals, Kids flip-flops (small sizes 4-8), Crayons, socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), girls & boys underwear, \$9/box

**Third Grade** – Bunches of girls hair ties/scrunchies, underwear (small sizes- girls and boys), pre-sharpened pencils, crayons, kids flip-flops, pack of small balls, socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), \$9/box.

**Fourth Grade** – Socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), girls & boys small underwear (sizes 4-8), pre-sharpened pencils, tooth brushes (no toothpaste), kids flip-flops, pack of small balls, \$9/box.

**Fifth Grade** – Socks (sizes for 5-10 year olds), girls & boys small underwear (sizes 4-8), kids flip flops, pre-sharpened pencils, small stuffed animals, markers, toothbrushes (no toothpaste), \$9/box.

**Sixth Grade** – Toothbrushes (no toothpaste), washcloths, hairbrushes & combs, socks (sizes for 10-12 years), underwear (sizes 10-12 years), markers, bars of soap packs, \$9/box.

**Seventh Grade** – Toothbrushes, washcloths, hairbrushes & combs, socks (sizes 10-12 years), underwear (sizes 10-12 years), markers, bars of soap packs, \$9/box.

**Eighth Grade** – Toothbrushes, wash cloths, hairbrushes & combs, socks (sizes 10-12 years), underwear (sizes 10-12 years), markers, bars of soap packs, \$9/box.

ALL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS - We are asking high school students to purchase materials to pack at least one individual box on their own, and include \$9 dollars in the box for shipping. 
Please join us on Friday, November 9 for our school-wide packing party. Family members are invited to participate with their children during their specific class packing time (packing party schedule to come).
