SCHOOL HISTORY

Maranatha Christian Schools, a non-profit educational institution and ministry of Maranatha Chapel, was established in 1991 as a preschool. The school grew by grade level each year and in 2006 the high school was launched with grades 9 and 10. The school is located on a 17.5-acre campus just west of Rancho Bernardo's 4S Ranch and east of Rancho Santa Fe. Maranatha serves an estimated 880 students in Transitional Kindergarten through 12th grade with approximately 405 students in Elementary, 220 students in Junior High and 240 students in High School. MCS also offers an International Student Program which makes up approximately 1% of our total student body population.

MISSION

ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIP

MCS is dual-accredited by Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and Association for Christian Teachers and Schools (ACTS). MCS holds membership in the College Board and California Interscholastic Federation (CIF).

CLASS RANK AND GRADING SYSTEM

The school operates on a semester basis with progress grades issued at six week intervals. Grade point average is based on all courses (except those which are pass/fail) taken in grades 9-12. Grade Point Average is based on a 4.0 scale. Honors and Advanced Placement courses are based on a 5.0 scale. We do not rank students based on their GPAs.

HONORS / ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Honors courses (8 courses) are offered in the following subjects: English 9, English 10, Principles of Engineering, Algebra 2, World History, Spanish 2, Spanish 3 and Art 2.

Advanced Placement (17 courses) are offered in Biology, Chemistry, Physics I, Physics II, AP PreCalculus, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Computer Science A (alternating years), Computer Science Principles, Statistics, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, U.S. History, U.S. Government, Spanish Language (alternating years), and Studio Art 2-D. **AP is an open-enrollment program.**

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The total number of credits required for graduation from Maranatha Christian Schools is **250.** Each course earns 5 credits per semester. Students in grades 9-11 take at least five core courses and one elective per year. The 250 credit total <u>must</u> include the following courses:
