
Keeping track of academic growth continues to be a primary focus. In January, our Elementary students completed MAP testing which allows MCS to analyze each student's individualized academic achievements.

The Girls Basketball team won the D-3 CIF Championship with a dominating 64-45 win over Rancho Buena Vista. It is the eighth CIF Championship for Maranatha and the second for Girls Basketball who won the D-5 title in 2017. With the win, the girls advanced to the state playoffs and took on Trinity Classical Academy. It was a hard fought battle for our girls but Trinity prevailed 71-63.
